

# Human Service Outcomes

**Theory of Change Statement:** *By providing funding to organizations with a human service mission, the Telluride Foundation expects to improve the quality of life of the Telluride Region by ensuring that residents of all ages and socioeconomic status have access to effective safety net services, including sufficient food, shelter, basic needs and human service resources, including access to tools and programs that promote economic self-sufficiency and decrease crime and abuse.*

**Outcomes:**

- 1) Families & Individuals have access to sufficient food, shelter, basic needs, and safety net resources.
- 2) Families meet household's economic self-sufficiency standards
- 3) Decrease in crime, abuse, and incarceration
